



ABINGDON

The pupils and staff of Abingdon School are undertaking a sponsored walk from Donnington Bridge along the Thames Path back to Abingdon (a distance of about 8 miles) to raise funds for four charities:

AGAPE- works with young people in Moldova, the poorest country in Europe. Abingdon School has been working with this charity since 2000. For the last eight years sixth formers from Abingdon have helped to run summer camps for under-privileged children there.

BRITISH RED CROSS- is a volunteer-led humanitarian organisation that helps people in crisis, whoever and wherever they are. They enable vulnerable people at home and overseas to prepare for and respond to emergencies in their own communities.

ALZHEIMER RESEARCH UK-is the UK's leading dementia research charity specialising in finding preventions, treatments and a cure for dementia.

BREAKTHROUGH BREAST CANCER- a major UK research charity that is dedicated to saving lives by finding the causes of breast cancer, improving detection, diagnosis, treatment and services. OA Mr Nick Rees is currently raising money for the organisation by rowing, unsupported and self-sufficiently, from the Canary Islands to Antigua- a journey of almost 3,000miles in the Talisker Whisky Atlantic Challenge.
