The new A Level System (phase 2)

Gove's changes

- * All qualifications being reformed in phases.
- * AS being decoupled from A Level it no longer contributes to overall A Level.
- * Linear assessment i.e. exams at the end of the course. No modularity.
- * Subjects being reformed over a period of 3 years, so there will be a mix of old and new for a while.

Phased Change

- * 2015: Art, English, Economics, Business Studies, History, Psychology, Biology, Chemistry, Physics
- * 2016: Geography, Theatre Studies, DT, French, German, Spanish, Music, Latin, Greek, RS
- * 2017: Ancient History, Politics, Maths, Philosophy

Linear Opportunities

* Release from shackles of AS exam at end of L6th which has meant focusing on exam requirements from an early stage and loss of teaching time.

More creative curriculum planning

- * Bringing harder/more interesting work into L6.
- Freedom to cover off-syllabus topics.
- * More teaching time (no study leave in L6, summer term is teaching and learning, not exam technique).
- * Ability for boys to change subjects later on in year.

Curriculum Plan

- * L6th: boys choose 4 subjects.
- * Pursue courses until at least the summer of L6th.
- * Decide whether to drop a subject for U6th.
- * Take 3 or 4 subjects through to A Level in U6th.

Curriculum Plan

- * If boys drop a subject, it won't result in a qualification.
 - * Abingdon does not confuse education with exams.
 - * Universities want 3 A Levels.
 - * They will still have had the breadth of study without having to worry about exam criteria.
 - * Course will still have been rigorous any one of them might be taken to A Level.

Overarching Check Points

- * November Tests in L6th.
- * Rigorous Summer Exam after half term in L6th (akin to current AS) a serious assessment of where they stand. Predicted grades.
- * Mock Exams in Easter of U6th

A Level alternative: pre-U

- * Pre-U (Cambridge International), established since 2008.
- * Comparable with A Level though it has a different grading system (D,M,P each with 3 levels)
- * Now a proven reliable route and universities understand it.
- * Other schools doing pre-U: Eton, Charterhouse, Winchester, Oundle, Marlborough

A Level alternative: pre-U

- * We choose the best courses for our boys thinking about challenge, interest, university preparation.
- * From September 2015, MFL have been pursuing pre-U.
 - * Have looked at new AL proposals; this fits our criteria better.
 - * Criteria-referenced assessment.
 - * Good links with other schools who have been doing it shared experiences.
- * Other subjects are looking/have considered it though at the moment A Levels are most suitable.

University Position

- * They want 3 A Levels (or equivalent). They are confident they will be able to identify best candidates without AS:
 - * GCSE
 - * Predictions
 - * Personal Statement
 - Academic Reference achievement & potential
 - * Entrance Exams (Oxford, Medicine, Cambridge about to rejoin?)
- * They will know school context; we will be explicit in refs.
- * If you sit an AS, you must declare it on UCAS form, whatever its quality (even if it was your '4th' subject).

University Position

- * They like breadth of study (e.g. a 4th subject) even if it hasn't been taken to A Level. We will comment on 4th subject in references.
- * Some university departments have a positive preference for additional study, e.g. Psychology, Mech Engineering, Architecture. See entry requirements.
- * They love the EPQ.

Extended Project Qualification

- * Well established now as a respected qualification.
- * Independent research project **they** choose what they want to study. Must not cross over with AL course content but might be inspired by it.
- * We teach them some methodology how to research, do citations, construct a bibliography...
- * They have a 1-2-1 supervisor who coaches them but does not 'teach' them; supposed to be outside of supervisor's subject area.

Extended Project Qualification

- * Opt for it in January of L6th
- * Summer Term + holiday is main research & writing
- * Presentation and marking in Autumn Term of U6th

Extended Project Qualification

Pilot scheme with current U6th

- * Checked secure on ALs (via Nov Tests)
- * Asked for volunteers: 8 boys will be submitting (twice that began the process about right/norm)

Current L6th: 50 showing initial interest

Other Sixth Form Strands

General Studies Core Skills in L6th

- Critical Thinking and Theory of Knowledge
- * Practical elements, such as writing letters of application, interview skills
- * MFL

General Studies courses in U6th

* Roundabout to cover some 'key' things (e.g. managing finances, research skills, health)

Other Sixth Form Strands

Extension Opportunities

- * Olympiads, Challenge Competitions & Scholarships
- * Performance opportunities
- * Trips & Visits
- * Clubs & Societies lectures, seminars, magazines etc.
- * Green Abingdon Project & our internal extended essay
