At the beginning of October we hosted our partner school from Germany, Ratsgymnasium Bielefeld. This partnership has been in existence for nearly 50 years and this year, to mark the centenary of WW1, both schools put together a joint exhibition. It was interesting to see the essays from German 18 year olds in 1914 talking about their fears at the onset of war; very similar to our own. We also welcomed staff and students from our Spanish exchange school this week. Other recent visitors include the eminent chemist, Dr Peter Wothers from Cambridge Univeristy who presented the Royal Society Christmas lectures in 2012. Dr Wothers gave an engaging talk to our pupils, and students from Headington and the Abingdon schools, as well as a masterclass to our sixth formers.

James Anderson-Besant assisted with playing the organ. Chapel Choir continues to grow in popularity and now has over 50 boys as members. Perhaps not quite so polished but with certainly as much enthusiasm, the House Singing competition raised the rafters of the Amey Theatre on Wednesday.
