

From the Head: Miss O.F.S. Lusk, B.Mus

Dear Parents, Colleagues, Governors and Boys of Abingdon,

We return to school after a very enjoyable summer break and welcome 189 new boys to Abingdon. Although the first few days can seem a little daunting, we have a very successful programme that helps boys to settle. It has been a pleasure to meet new parents as well as new boys this week and I am sure you will all enjoy your association with Abingdon. We also welcome a host of new faces to the academic and support staff. A full list of all the new staff appointments can be found at the end of this letter. I hope everyone's time here will be very happy.

Last month we congratulated our A level and GCSE students on excellent sets of results. 62% of A level passes were awarded an A* or A grade and an impressive 67 boys achieved three or more passes at A* or A. The vast majority of leavers secured their first choice for further education including Choral and Organ Scholarships to Oxford and Cambridge, the study of composition at the Royal Academy of Music, a wealth of places at Russell Group universities and prestigious U.S. colleges and other impressive institutions. At GCSE the boys achieved the best ever results at Abingdon with 60% of passes awarded the top A* grade. 32 boys gained a very impressive 10 or more A* grades and 95 students, over half of the year group, were awarded all A* or A grades. If you would like to take a look, our website shows the list of this year's leavers' destinations as well as further details on our A Level and GCSE results.

It is with a great sense of anticipation that we look forward to this term, in particular the opening of our new Science Centre in October. I must say it is absolutely stunning, overlooking the 1st XV rugby pitch, which also looks very impressive, manicured and ready to go! The senior rugby squad had a very successful threeweek tour of Australia and New Zealand in August, an incredible experience and one that will stay with the boys long after they have left Abingdon.

Over the summer Abingdon boys have recorded a number of outstanding achievements. Sixth former Anthony Bracey was part of the UK's team of four who won the International Linguistic Olympiad in Bulgaria at the end of July. This was the first ever win for the UK, competing against 170 competitors from 79 countries. Sixth former Sebastian Hickman was among 14 Abingdon boys who took part in the extremely rigorous Cambridge Chemistry Challenge. Seb recorded a fantastic score

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and secured the top Roentgenium award level. Seb was invited to the university for a three day Chemistry course and to an awards ceremony in November at the Wellcome Trust. Jack Dawson scored the highest overall mark nationally in A level History with the OCR exam board and has been recommended by OCR to the Royal Historical Society who award a prize to the top scoring candidate in History each year.

The summer holiday saw sixth formers running summer camps for children in Moldova, performing at The Fringe, taking part in field trips to India and Honduras and CCF summer camp at RAF Waddington. Our sportsmen competed or trained in Rio, France, Greece, Slovenia and in the UK at Cowes. In the international arena, four Abingdon rowers represented Great Britain and England and an Abingdon pupil won the U18 Marathon Kayak Junior European Championships for Great Britain. Footballers, Aaron Mara, William Lebeau and Theo Zamani, were selected for the U13 South Central Independent Schools Development Squad at the Gothia Cup in Sweden where 75 nations competed. Ben Schneider, representing England, won the individual epee at the Junior Commonwealth Fencing Championships, in Cape Town, South Africa. I congratulate all the boys on these marvellous achievements.

I look forward to the term ahead knowing that life for an Abingdon boy will bring many diverse experiences, achievements, challenges and fun. I hope that everyone, boys and staff, enjoys this Michaelmas term.
