

From Head of Classics: Chris Burnand

Friday 18 October - Thursday 24 October 2019

Sicily is the biggest and one of the most beautiful islands of the Mediterranean, so fertile that it was considered the birthplace of Demeter. This and its central location meant that it lay at the heart of conflicts between all the major ancient powers over the course of several centuries. The Greeks colonised it from the 8th century BC, and in the 5th century it was the site of a critical campaign in the Peloponnesian War, as the Athenian expedition to the island was destroyed. Later it became the scene of bitter conflict between the Romans and Carthaginians. Even after the final Roman victory it remained a vital strategic location during the civil wars at the end of the Republic.

The remains from all periods of this history are stunning: the unfinished temple and hill-top theatre of Segesta, the rich array of temples at Agrigento and Selinunte, the town and prison-quarries of Syracuse where the Athenian prisoners were held in appalling conditions, the theatre at the attractive city of Taormina, the 36,000 square feet of mosaics at Piazza Armerina, which are amongst the very finest in the world. But we will also have the chance to explore beyond the classical world, whether that be the golden mosaics of Monreale, hill-top medieval villages or majestic Etna.

We will be staying at three hotels; the tour price will include half-board, air fares, and all travel in Sicily and entry to the sites (but not the cost of lunches or of getting to the British airport from Abingdon: I will organise a coach for those who wish to use it).

The cost will be in the region of £850-900 (depending on the size of the final party). Payment for the trip should be made through WisePay. Note that by completing the consent form you are committing to the full cost of the trip, provided it goes ahead. If payment is not received through WisePay, the school reserves the right to add the charge to your next termly bill.

Once your son's place is secured, the school will endeavour to make bookings and reservations to procure the best possible deals and the timing of payments is not necessarily a reflection of when the liability has been incurred.
