## Scholars' Events

The summer term has come around quickly, and as the boys prepare for the busy examination period we would like to draw attention to the last Roysse Society Lecture of the academic year.

The talk will be given by OA and award winning architect Philip Johnson of Populous, an acclaimed and internationally renowned architecture firm, based in London. It will be held in the Amey Theatre on Wednesday 8 May, and shall begin at 5.30pm and last for an hour. Senior Principal at Populous, Philip led the design of the London Olympic Stadium, and has also worked on projects at Lord's Cricket Ground, Ascot Racecourse and The All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club. His talk will focus on these projects, his career path, but also touch upon his particular interest in sports and entertainment buildings, how venues evolve, and how they can be integrated successfully into their environment. It promises to be a great opportunity for the boys to hear from an architect working at the highest level.

The talk is compulsory for all scholars except those in the fifth year (who will already be on study leave), though they are most welcome to come along as well for what should be a fascinating topic. Parents are also extremely welcome, and since we are in the Amey Theatre there will be plenty of room for anyone who is interested and wishes to come along.
