re: Duke of Edinburgh's Award Bronze Canoeing Expeditions

Introduction to Canoeing Expeditions

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme at Abingdon School allows for expeditions to be completed via the waterways in an open canoe in addition to the standard walking routes. This unique opportunity allows boys to explore some of the inland waterways of the UK and also experience some gentle white water, under close supervision.

Availability of places on Canoeing Expeditions

Places on canoeing expeditions are very limited and are highly sought after, therefore boys must be willing to show commitment at an early stage.

At Bronze Award level there are only 8 places available and priority will be given to those boys who have paddled with the school Canoe Club or have previous canoeing experience. After taking all these considerations, the availability of places will then be considered on a 'first come, first served' basis. Should boys be unsuccessful in applying for the canoeing expeditions they will still have the opportunity to join the walking groups, if they so wish.

At Silver Award level there are also only 8 places available. Access to this award from Bronze level is highly sought after and unfortunately there aren't enough places available for all boys. Priority will be given to those boys who have made a conscious effort to complete their entire DofE Bronze Award and have shown a high degree of interest and leadership in Canoeing.

Dates

At Bronze Award level there are two compulsory expeditions and a planning day in school.

By signing up to the Bronze Award, boys <u>must</u> take part in and complete the training morning and both expedition weekends. Failure to do so will result in them not completing the expedition section and therefore not obtaining the award at this level, unless they can find an external open award expedition to complete. It may also put the expedition numbers at risk for the remaining boys. Therefore, please consider if your son will be available for all three dates before applying for him to join the award.

Costs

The major costs associated with the scheme are for the joining materials and travel expenses for the expeditions, although every effort is made to keep these to a minimum.

Joining fee	£55.00
Practice expedition	£70.00 (approx.)
Assessment expedition	£95.00 (approx.)

The joining fee is payable on application and both expedition fees will be charged to the school bill at the end of the Michaelmas term.

These costs are per boy and cover items such as travel, campsite fees, river licenses, maps and safety equipment. All paddling equipment will be provided by the school Canoe Club and will include: open canoe, paddle, waterproof kit barrel, buoyancy aid, helmet, cagoule and all other associated safety equipment. The school will also provide a tent and cooking apparatus for each expedition.

Boys are expected to provide all other camping equipment and personal canoeing equipment, and guidance can be sought from school staff if needed.

Equipment

A guide to equipment and cooking for DofE Canoeing will be provided to all boys accepted on the Canoeing expeditions. This will be discussed further on the school training day however please contact us if you require any advice on purchasing any specialist equipment.

Joining the Scheme

An application to take part in the DofE Canoeing expeditions is made via the Bronze DofE application form; prospective canoeists should indicate on this form if they wish to apply for Canoeing instead of Walking.

Applications for Canoeing must be submitted to Mr Johnson, via the MCR, by <u>Wednesday 28 June 2017</u> with a supporting letter explaining previous canoeing experience and any relevant qualifications.

Please also indicate if your son would like to undertake the expedition by foot should their application be unsuccessful.

Boys will be informed before the Summer break if they have been successful in gaining a place or not and they are encouraged to join the School Canoe Club in the Michaelmas Term.
