## Third Year Relationships and Sex Education, Wednesday 26 May

Wednesday 26 May sees the annual *Relationship and Sex Education* morning for students in the Third Year. This year we have an online live visit from Loudmouth Theatre Company who will present their acclaimed play "*Working for Marcus*". Sexual exploitation and sexual grooming are important issues for schools to address. "*Working for Marcus*" has been used in many schools to raise awareness of child sexual exploitation and to train professionals since 1998. Due to a recent rise in interest in this work and growing concerns about the issues from schools particularly in online safety, Loudmouth have updated this powerful programme to include new research into exploitation through social media, gangs and violence against women and children. The drama production and workshops help young people to gain a deeper understanding of the grooming process and potential risks. There will also be a live follow up session for students to follow up on the play and ask any questions they might have.

In addition, the students will attend a roundabout of workshops which includes topics such as sexual transmitted infections, contraception, consent, practical use of condoms together with men's health issues. These will be delivered by registered healthcare practitioners and nurses as well as the School Doctor.
