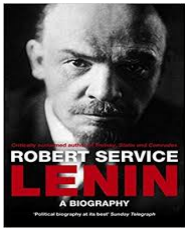


## Russia 1905-24 IGCSE - broadening your thinking and understanding

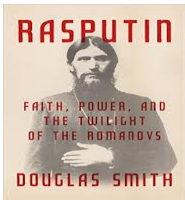
### Academic books:



A genuinely accessible book and written by one of the great authors of Russian history. Cheap too! It is not too lengthy either.

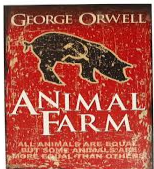


A very lengthy and challenging read. It is for the more ambitious pupil, but it is excellent.
